Life on Other Planets

Could there be life elsewhere in the universe? There are some people who think that it's possible. They have given the idea a name, extra-terrestrial life. 'Extra' means 'beyond' and 'terrestrial' means 'of the Earth', so the name means 'life beyond the Earth'.

A more common word to describe the idea is 'aliens'. These are usually shown as strange-looking creatures with green skin, one or three eyes and six or more limbs. Nobody has seen a real 'alien' from another planet, so artists draw whatever they imagine an alien would look like.

Film-makers and science fiction writers have been very fascinated by this idea of aliens or extra-terrestrials. It is very different from the real world and can be quite entertaining. The 1982 film E.T. the Extra-Terrestrial is about a young boy, Alex, who discovers an alien near his house. The alien had been left behind by his family.

Alex names the thing E.T., but he soon realizes that E.T. cannot survive in Earth's atmosphere. He would have to return to his home planet. Alex and the alien become good friends. With the help of Alex, his siblings, and their friends, E.T. sends a message to his planet. But scientists get to know about E.T., and decide to capture and study E.T. instead of allowing him to return home.

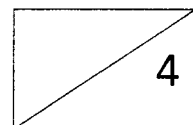
