- 23) What is meant by the term 'Break in monsoon'? Describe the mechanism of monsoons. (any four) (1+4)

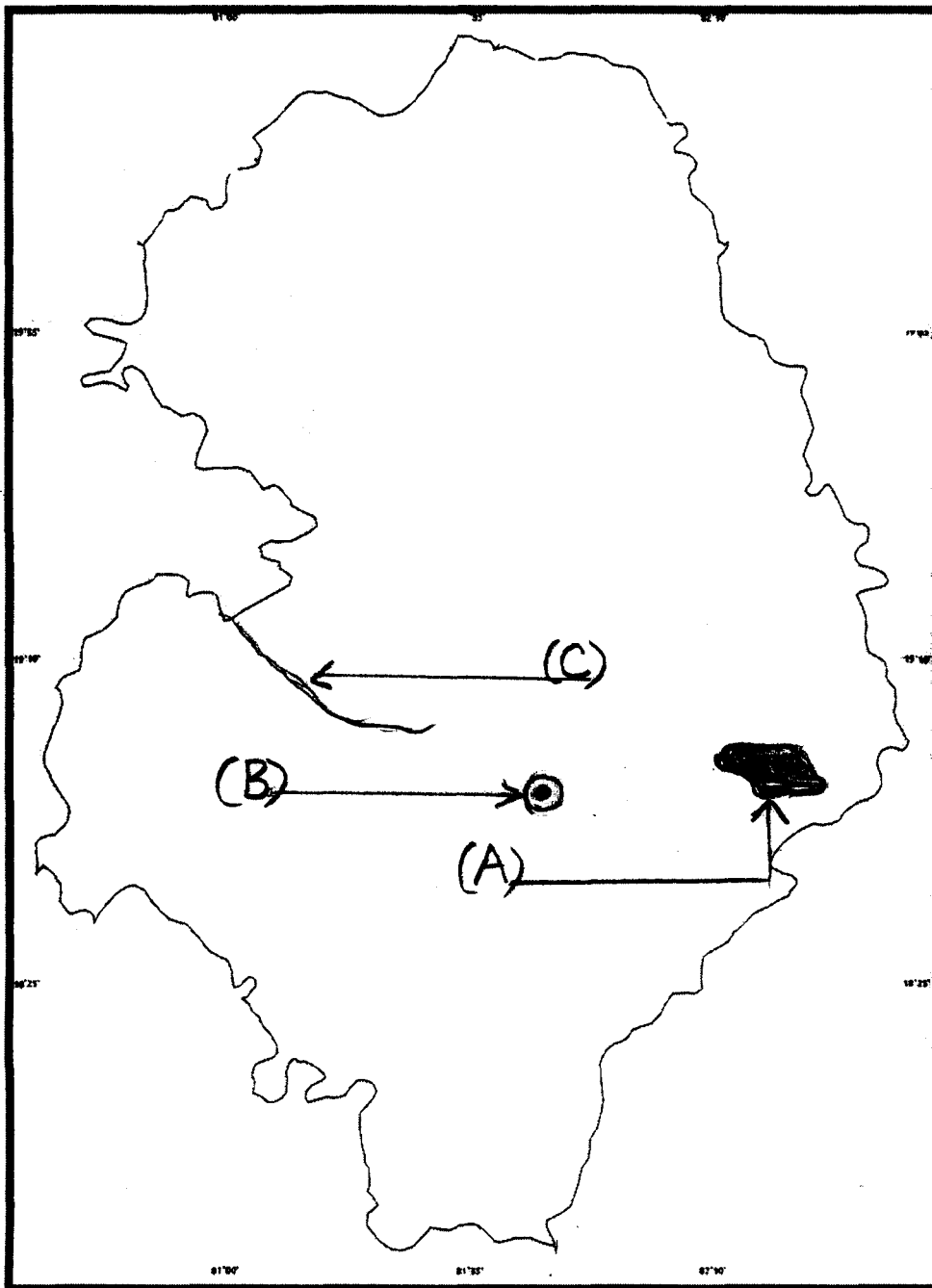
