Turtles have existed for millions of years. They belong to the reptile family because they lay eggs, have lungs for breathing air and are cold – blooded. There are seven types of turtles in the world and most of them live in the warm tropical oceans.

Turtles spend nearly all their time in the water, but need to come to the surface regularly to breathe. They sleep mostly on the surface of the water. Sea turtles have four strong flippers like paddles to help them swim. Turtles are actually close relatives of tortoises. However, unlike tortoises, turtles cannot pull their heads into their shells.

Turtles feed on algae and sea grasses. Rather than teeth, turtles possess beak-like mouths to crush their food. They drink seawater, which explains why they have to “cry salty tears” to rid their bodies of unnecessary salt.

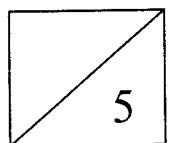
