

It is a blinking line (|) on the monitor.



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STORAGE DEVICES

The place where we store our things are called **storage places**.

Al mirah is a storage place to keep our clothes, toys and books.
School bag is a storage place to keep our books, lunch box, water bottle etc.
Lunch box is also a storage place to store your food that you can carry to school.

Similarly a DVD or a PENDRIVE is used to store data. You can store games, letters, stories, drawings, songs, cartoons etc. in them. You can use the stored data whenever you need it.





External HDD





A hard disk is also a device used by computers to store data. Hard disk can be inside(internal) and outside (external) the CPU box.
