

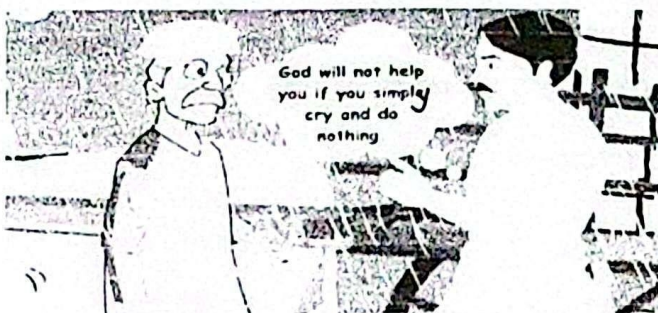

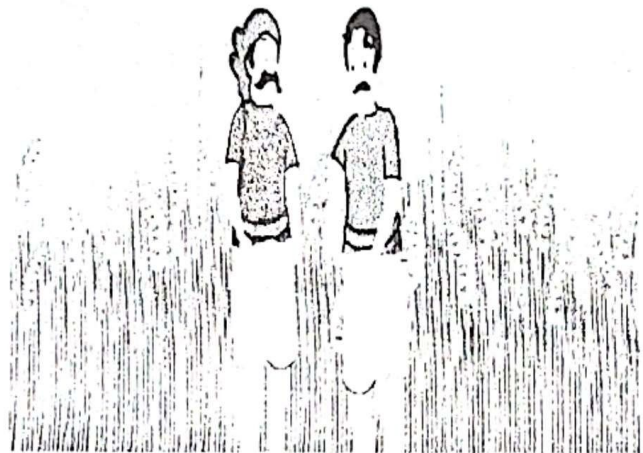

Though the sons were disappointed, they sowed the seeds. That year, the monsoon brought good rain. The lush green plants waved across the entire field.

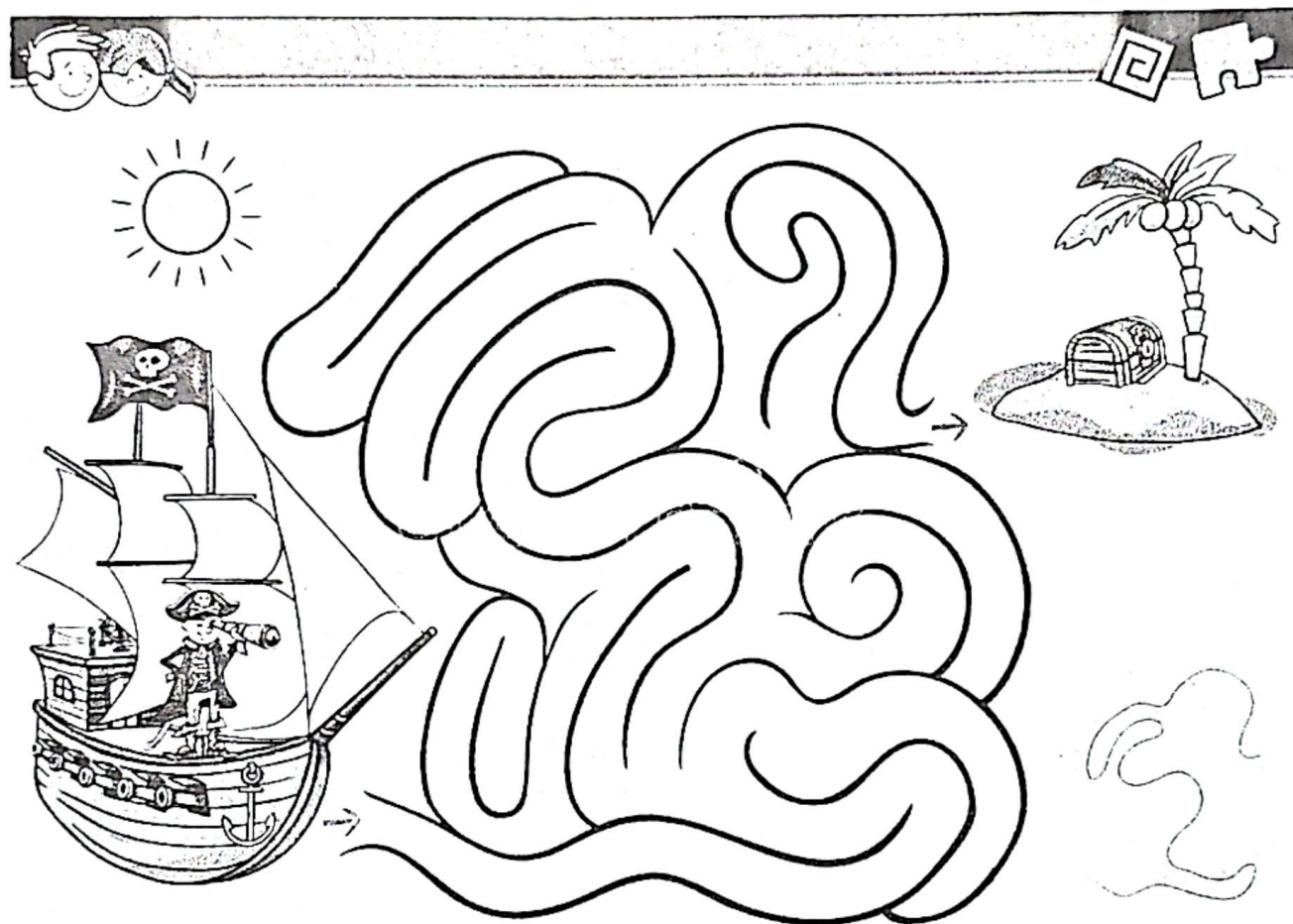
Time passed and the crops ripened. The field was covered with beautiful golden crops. The three sons were delighted to see the fruits of their hard work.



The farmer called his sons and said, "My dear children, the treasure of our field is this crop and you can collect this treasure every year with your hard work."

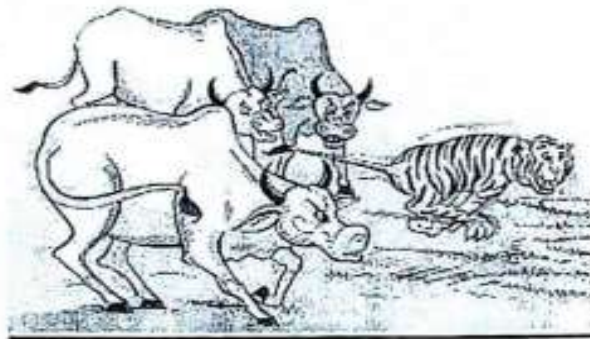
MORAL: The treasure of life lies in hard work.
