BAPU'S THREE MONKEYS




Mahatma Gandhi was a great man of India. He is called the 'Father of the Nation.' People call him 'Bapu' also. He always kept a model of three monkeys in his room. Each of them teaches us a moral lesson.

The first monkey keeps both its eyes covered with its hands. It says, "I see no evil." He advises us not to see any evil. A good child should see noble things only.

The second monkey keeps both its ears covered with its hands. It says, "I hear no evil." He advises us not to listen to anyone who speaks evil things. A good child should hear noble things only.

The third monkey keeps its mouth covered with its hands. It says, "I speak no evil." In this way, he advises us not to speak evil things. A good child should speak noble words only.

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

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DO GOOD HAVE GOOD




