ANTARCTICA

Antarctica is located in the southern hemisphere of the Earth. It is the fifth-largest continent in the world. It is nearly twice the size of Australia. About 98% of Antarctica is covered by ice. In fact, 90% of the world's ice is in Antarctica. The weather in Antarctica is the coldest on Earth. Because it is a "polar" region, it has no lakes or rivers and is, in fact, the driest continent. Antarctica has six months of daylight in its summer and six months of darkness in its winter. Only one native warm-blooded animal remains on the Antarctic continent during the freezing winter—the Emperor Penguin. Even though a lot of people think so, no polar bears live in Antarctica. It is the most isolated place on the Earth. It is the largest desert in the world. The main mineral resource known on the continent is coal. Many countries have research stations in Antarctica. The two Indian research stations in Antarctica are 'Maitri' and 'Bharati'. Antarctica is becoming more and more popular as a tourist destination. The chance to see whales in their natural habitat and visit penguin colonies made up of millions of birds attract many tourists.
