READING COMPREHENSION-(SEEN PASSAGE)

Hornbills do not have a lining of feathers under their wings like other birds. So, when they fly, the wind rushes through their wings with a loud whoosh. When they land, there is a lot of croaking and barking. There are sixty-two different types of hornbills in the world. Most of these live in rainforests. They are large and colourful birds. The Great Indian Hornbill has a golden-yellow beak and a helmet on top of its black face. Males and females look alike, but females are usually smaller. All hornbills have throat pouches in which they carry fruit. This way, they do not have to make several trips to collect food. Hornbills stay with one partner for their whole life. They find holes in trees and build nurseries in them. Mother hornbills shut themselves in these holes to lay eggs and keep their babies safe. Father hornbills fly around and bring food for the family. Hornbills are extremely clever and always pick lone trees at the edge of forests. From there, they can spot danger and escape if a hunter comes along. At dawn, they fly off again to feed inside the forest.
